

Salaam Academy Dress Code

We wish for every child to receive a high standard of education and reach their full potential. To do this, we aim to provide a safe, caring and stimulating environment. We endeavour to develop their religious, moral, and social values and promote discipline, behaviour, excellent personal manners and mutual respect.

Our Dress Code is designed to reinforce the positive Islamic value of modesty and all children are required to abide by the dress code.

Parents have a vital role to play in their children's education. It is very important that they support their child in adhering to the dress code of the madrassah.

Parents responsibilities are:

- To ensure that the dress code for the madrassah is observed
- If for any reason you cannot send your child to madrasah with the correct dress code, you must send a signed and dated note to explain why.

Boys Dress Code (Reception to Year 9)

Shalwar Qamees, Thobe or long shirt over loose trousers of any colour

Girls Dress Code (Reception to Year 9)

- Wear a loose, non fitted, full length Abaya of any colour.
- Have all their hair covered with a headscarf of any colour.

Boys Dress Code (Year 10 to Year 13)

• Modest dress suitable for the masjid environment

Girl's Dress Code (Year 10 to Year 13)

- Modest dress suitable for the masjid environment
- Have all their hair covered with a headscarf of any colour.

Non Adherence to Dress Code

Verbal warnings

Will be given for incorrect dress code

Parents Informed

After 2 verbal warnings a written comment will be sent to the parents. The child may also be given a detention under teacher discretion



Consistent violation of Dress Code

Continued violation of dress code will result in a detention. Parents will be called in to attend a behaviour meeting with the Headmaster or Deputy Head for any pupil who has been issued with more than 2 detentions in a term. If this meeting is not successful at resolving the issue, further action will be required and may result in suspension or exclusion at the discretion of the Head Teacher and the Shura.
