<b>Excellent</b>	Excellent adaab and conduct. Kind, friendly and helpful to peers. Respectful to the teacher. Attends lessons punctually and is always fully equipped and ready to work. Focussed, pays full attention. Answer questions and is engaged with the lesson. Always gives their very best and tries hard.
<b>Good</b>	Good adaab and conduct. Kind, friendly and helpful to peers. Respectful to the teacher. Attends lessons punctually. Tries hard and puts in a good effort. May be a bit chatty occasionally and may sometimes not be on task / focussed or equipped. May not always put their hand up to answer questions.
<b>Satisfactory</b>	Good adaab and conduct. Kind, friendly and helpful to peers. Respectful to the teacher. Tries hard and makes an effort. May not always be punctual, equipped or focused.
<b>Needs Improvement</b>	Poor adaab and conduct. Distracts peers and disrupts the lesson. Unkind to peers. Not focussed and does not make an effort. Often late and often forgets equipment.

<b>Good</b>	Homework is completed to a good standard but rarely not completed.
<b>Satisfactory</b>	Homework is completed to an acceptable standard but occasionally not completed.
<b>Needs Improvement</b>	Homework is frequently not completed and the standard is poor.

## 5. Comment

### COMMENT

- Mandatory to comment if the student has been graded 'R'. R means the student will most likely have to repeat the level (if at the end of the year) or drop a level (if at end of the Autumn / Spring term).
- **For grades other than 'R'**: Optional for Autumn and Spring Term. Mandatory in the Summer Term.
- This is a useful space for providing more detail on any of the above assessments.
- Please be courteous, positive and encouraging (imagine how the Prophet (saw) would say it).
- Phrase comments positively rather than negatively (eg "Ali would benefit from paying more attention" is better than, "Ali never pays attention").
