- → For grades other than 'R': Optional for Autumn and Spring Term. Mandatory in the Summer Term
- → This is a useful space for providing more detail on any of the above assessments.
- → Please be courteous, positive and encouraging (imagine how the Prophet (saw) would say it).
- → Phrase comments positively rather than negatively (eg "Ali would benefit from paying more attention" is better than, "Ali never pays attention").
